# SECOND QUARTER REPORT





Welcome to the Second Quarter Report for 2024. This quarter has been remarkable for the global and local markets, and I am excited to share our performance and insights with you.

#### **Market Overview**

The MSCI World Index saw a 3% gain this quarter, driven primarily by the AI theme, which continues to be a key driver of returns. On the local front, the JSE All Share Index surged by 8%, buoyed by significant political changes. The Rand strengthened by 4% against the US Dollar, reflecting market optimism following the return of a government of national unity—the most significant political shift in 30 years.

Investment excellence remains one of our key principles and the consistency of the Centaur BCI Flexible and Balanced Funds stand out being top quartile performers for periods one year and longer.\*

# The Second Quarter

The second quarter marked a solid performance for equity markets globally. In the US, the S&P 500 continued its upward trend, returning 4%. Nvidia, a key player in the AI revolution, saw a 37% increase, temporarily becoming the world's most valuable company.

Locally, the JSE and the Rand were positively impacted by favourable election results. The JSE All Share Index returned 8% in Rand and 12% in US Dollars. Our investment strategy, which favours JSE-listed South African-centric businesses, proved advantageous amidst these changes.

#### **Political Shifts and Economic Implications**

For some time, we have held the view JSE listed South African centric businesses offered a favourable risk-reward profile. The recent election results and subsequent market response has brought this to the fore. The country faces multiple challenges, but the newly formed Government of National Unity (GNU) offers hope, if we are to see sustained improvements in the local investment landscape this hope must be turned into action.

Over the last 12 months we have seen evidence of structural reform. Eskom is nearing 100 days without load-shedding, the Eskom transmission company has been unbundled as a critical step towards grid expansion, there is some private sector involvement in ports and rail. Additionally, Ibrahim Patel retired from the Department of Trade and Industry, and the President, has appointed members of opposition parties to critical cabinet positions. In South Africa, we have grown accustomed to disappointment, which is reflected in our asset prices, but what if we are at an inflection point?

This brings us to the concept of the Lollapalooza effect, a phrase attributed to Charlie Munger, that describes how an event can trigger a positive or negative chain reaction. South Africa might be at a juncture where such a lollapalooza could take place. Firstly, the positive election outcome should be followed by lower interest rates in the latter part of this year. This could foster greater consumer confidence as structural reforms become more evident and lower interest rates leave more disposable income in pockets. Finally, this sequence of events could kick-start better economic growth and enable our banks to lend part of their excess R500bn credit capacity. South Africa is coming off a very low base and not much needs to go right for a positive feedback loop.

We are investing our client's capital in South African businesses that have upside economic optionality but are paid to wait via attractive dividend yields or where self-help actions are improving a business from within.

#### **Centaur Developments**

Centaur's asset under management grew 18% in the first half of 2024 to R9.5 billion. After displaying excellent portfolio management skill Nicholas de Vos is now the primary Fund Manager of both the Centaur BCI Balanced and SA Equity Funds. In our pursuit of excellence, we are strengthening capabilities and delighted to welcome Matt King to our Investment Team. We also revamped our website reflecting the core values and successes that define Centaur.

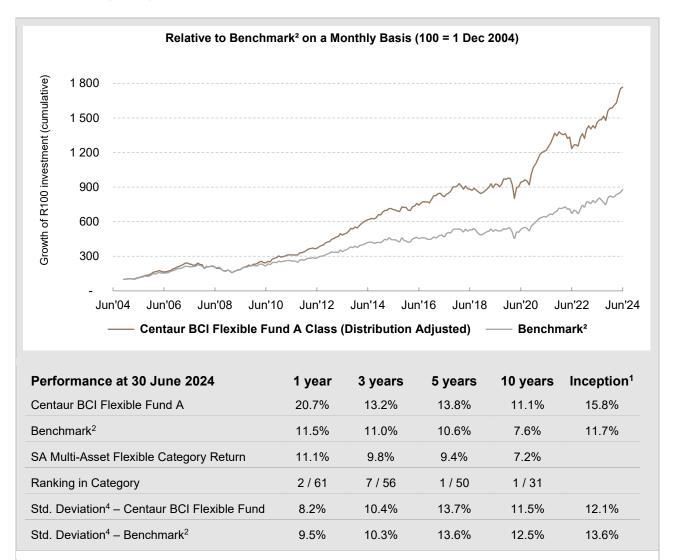

### **Fund Strategy and Adjustments**

The Fund's equity content was flat for the quarter as it actively increased its South African exposure during a volatile period in the local market caused by election jitters. Offshore equities reduced by 5% as the Fund took profits from strong market action. Offshore cash increased 3% from the sales whilst the balance was repatriated to fund local equity exposure.

#### **New Additions and Exits**

We added new local positions in Netcare and Bidcorp and continued to accumulate shares in Prosus, Sasol, and Truworths. We exited small holdings in Astral and Pick n Pay, while strategically trimming positions in Aspen, Remgro, and Anglo American. The offshore equity component continued to accumulate Philips and Flutter, whilst materially trimming Dell and exiting Repsol into share price strength.

## **Top Performers**

The fund's relative outperformance was driven by overweight positions in African Rainbow Minerals, Truworths, and Wilson Bayly Holmes whilst offshore returns were bolstered by Brilliance Automotive and Dell.

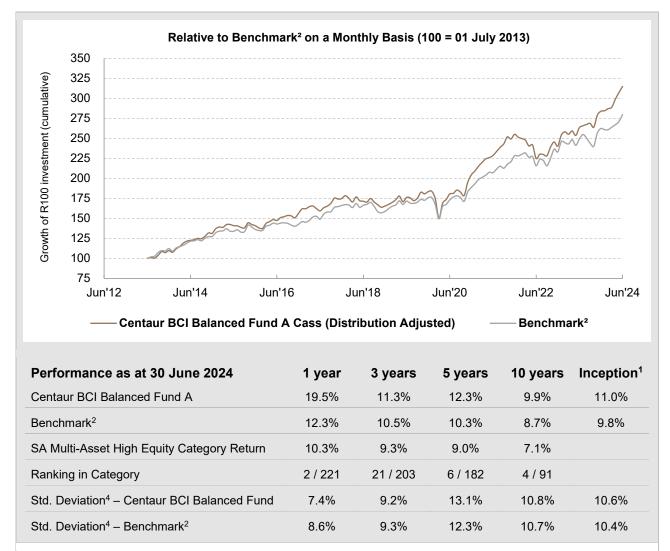
# Centaur BCI Balanced Fund



The Centaur BCI Balanced Fund increased 9.0% over the quarter, is the fourth-best performing Fund in its category over 10 years, and a top quartile performer over all periods of one or more years.

### **Fund Strategy and Adjustments**

Centaur's BCI Balanced Fund moved marginally overweight equities during the quarter as it used election jitters to upweight SA equities whilst maintaining its offshore weighting. Local equity purchases were funded with local and offshore cash. The Fund maintained its marginal overweight exposure to SA bonds.

#### **New Additions and Exits**

The Fund added two new local positions during the quarter, Netcare and Bidcorp, whilst continuing to accumulate shares in existing holdings Prosus, Sasol and Truworths. Small holdings in Astral and Pick 'n Pay were exited whilst Aspen, Reunert and Anglo American was trimmed at opportune levels.

#### **Top Performers**

Relative outperformance was positively driven by overweight positions in African Rainbow Minerals, Truworths, and Altron. The offshore equity component initiated an equity holding in Jupiter Mines and continued to accumulate Philips, Brilliance Automotive and Flutter, whilst trimming Dell and exiting Repsol into price strength. The offshore component performed well due to strong performances of Brilliance Automotive and Dell.

### **Fund Strategy and Adjustments**

Centaur's BCI SA Equity Fund used market volatility ahead of local elections to increase its equity weighting from 82.7% at the start of the quarter to 98.7% by the end of the quarter.

#### **New Additions and Exits**

During the quarter, the Fund added four new holdings, namely Naspers, Netcare, and Nampak, whilst using M&A activity to partially switch Anglo American into BHP Group. The Fund continued to accumulate existing holdings in Sasol, Southern Sun and Curro whilst strategically trimming Momentum Metropolitan and Reunert at good levels.

#### **Top Performers**

The Fund's relative outperformance was driven by overweight positions in African Rainbow Minerals, Truworths and select smaller capitalisation stocks.

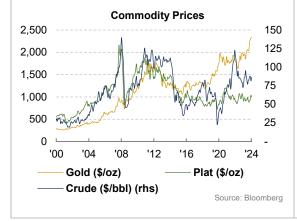
