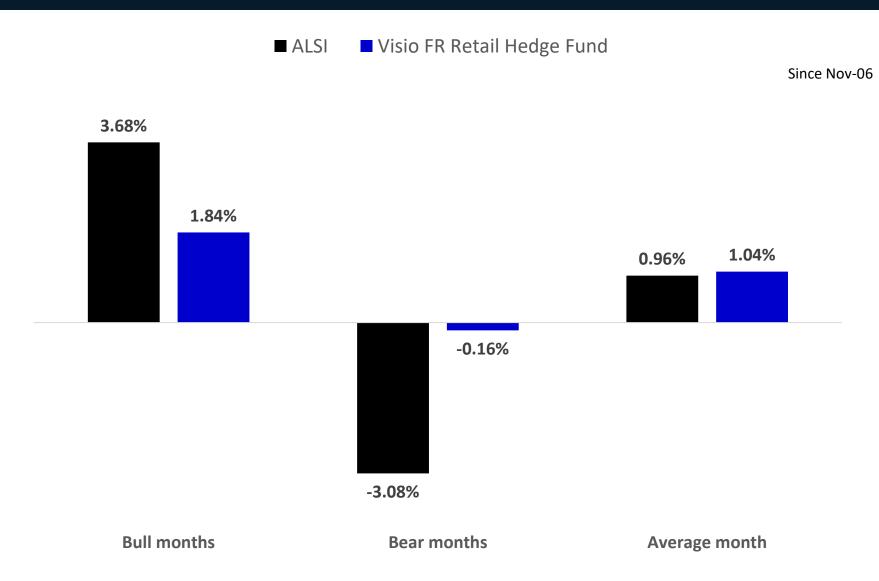








HEDGE FUND GOAL #1: ABSOLUTE RETURNS

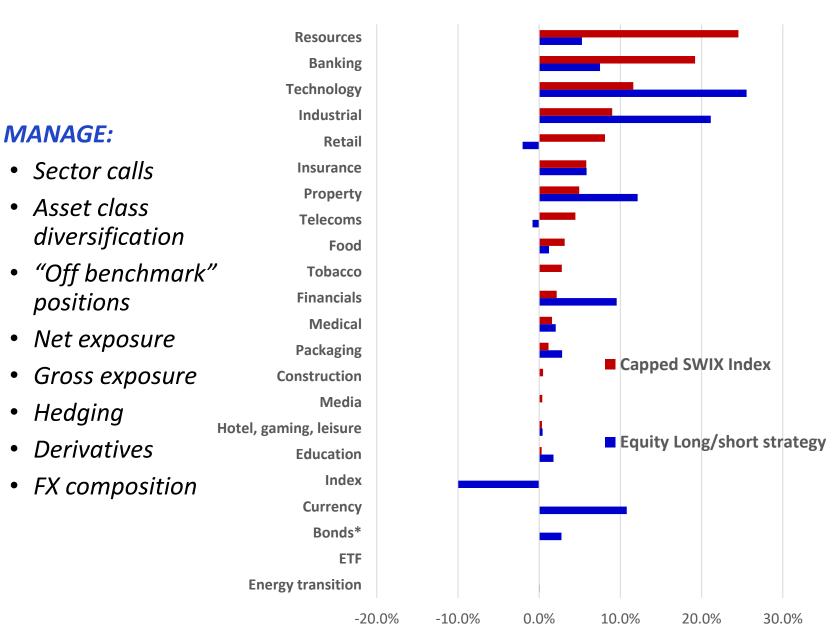


LOWERING CORRELATION

- Purchased at 35% of face value
- Double digit USD/Euro yields
- Equity like returns from bonds:
- Old Mutual, Std Bank, Consol, Peermont, Foodcorp, etc.
- All converged to 100% over time.
- Covid 2020 Sasol \$ Bonds, trading at 55% of face value. (5% of fund at that point, on a USD 12% YTW.)

- > Invicta's import and distribution model has some favourable characteristics:
 - > Low capex intensity, high operating leverage
 - > Good cash generation through the cycle
 - > The net realisable value of the inventory is R2.8bn
 - > Invicta's share price trading 40% below tangible value excl intangibles
 - > Company has undertaken 10% buybacks of its shares in the past 3 months. Also bought back over R750m of convertible preference shares in 2024.
- > The significant investment in working capital provides a strong moat through the cycle as customers rely on instant product availability
- > Strong cash generation through the cycle. (90% cash conversion over the past 3 years)
- > Invicta is on a 16% starting free cash flow yield. (This can grow at high single digits in a muddle-along-scenario, but offers the opportunity for mid-teens growth in an improved economic scenario.)

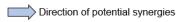

- > Execution underway exited Indluplace in July 2023.
- > Industrial portfolio nearly fully let at attractive rentals ripe for disposal.
- > Office disposals are ongoing.

We continue to hold given attractive yield and growth

- > 10.0% dividend yield. We forecast an 8.0% FY24 to FY27 DPS CAGR.
- > Our target price of c. R5.20 and forecast yield imply a c. 22.0% ETR.

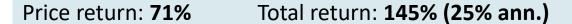

- Alex Forbes has successfully transitioned to a capital light operating model focused on its core competencies of pension fund administration and asset management.
- > 84% of shares are held by two key strategic shareholders, ARC and Prudential Financial and 8% by the AF share trust. Free float only 16%. (Visio owns 2%.)
- > A stable revenue base together with a fixed cost base and cost cutting (R150m head office cost saving in next three years), supports improved earnings growth.
- > All earnings are cash allowing Forbes to pay out 100% of free cash flow as dividends.
- Surplus capital has been declared as a special dividend resulting in a 2024 dividend yield of 16%
- > We believe there is a high probability of an offer to minorities in the next two years.

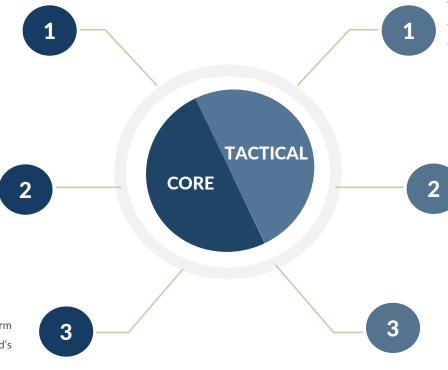
CORE AND TACTICAL PORTFOLIOS



The Core portfolio, which is **less price sensitive** and constitutes the **majority** of the holdings, invests in companies that the Managers believe will compound over meaningful time periods.

Core portfolio decisions are **fundamentally driven**, with a business case and an investment case, and when the two meet a position is built. The initial investments are relatively small (1% to 2% of the Fund) and as conviction in the investment builds the managers look to increase the position.

Over time, the Core portfolio of longer-term compounders is the **key driver** of the Fund's returns.



The more short-term Tactical portfolio is overlaid the Core portfolio and is crucial to the make-up of the Fund.

Tactical portfolio decisions are based on price action and are arguably more mechanised decisions, based on the manager's models. Triggers include flow data, momentum indicators, price action, sector correlations and factors, correlations across asset classes (fixed income, commodities, FX and equities – although the majority of the views are expressed through the equity variant), and earnings revision momentum.

The tactical portion uses short-term trading to generate alpha and smooth volatility of returns.

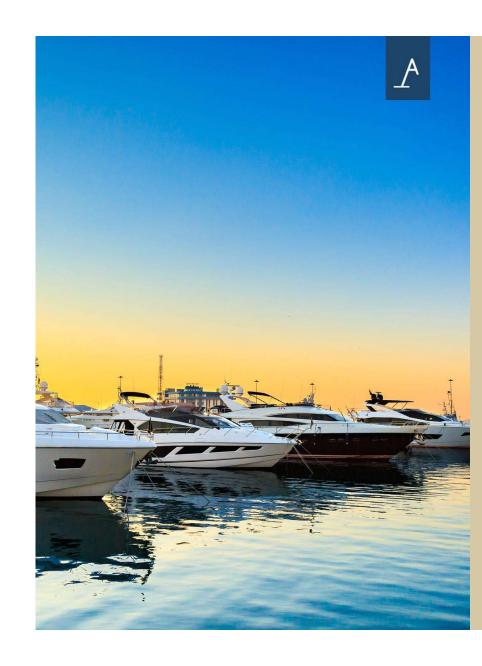

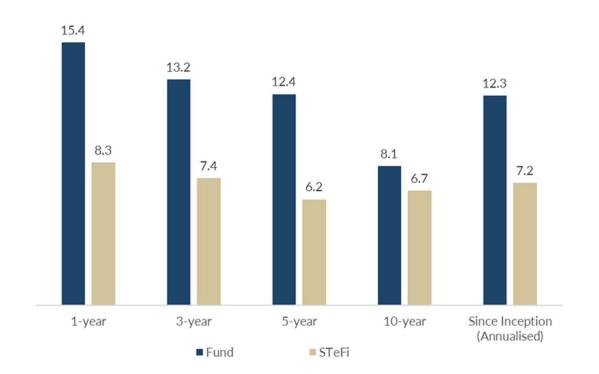

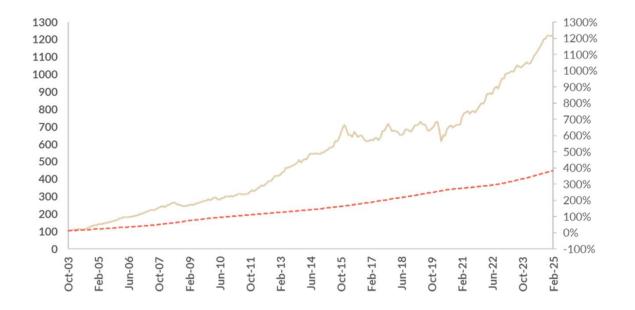
TRACK RECORD OF CONSISTENT DELIVERY IN SOUTH AFRICA

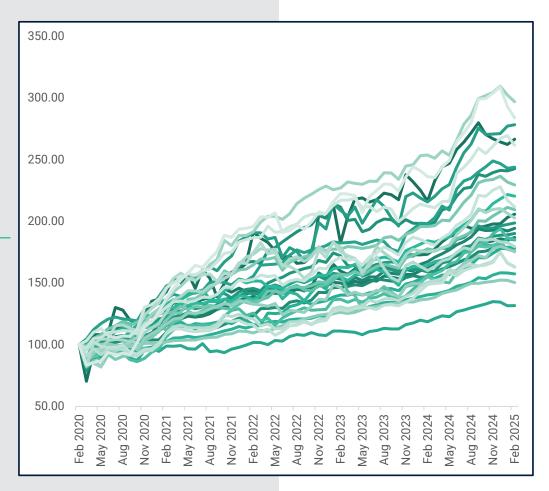

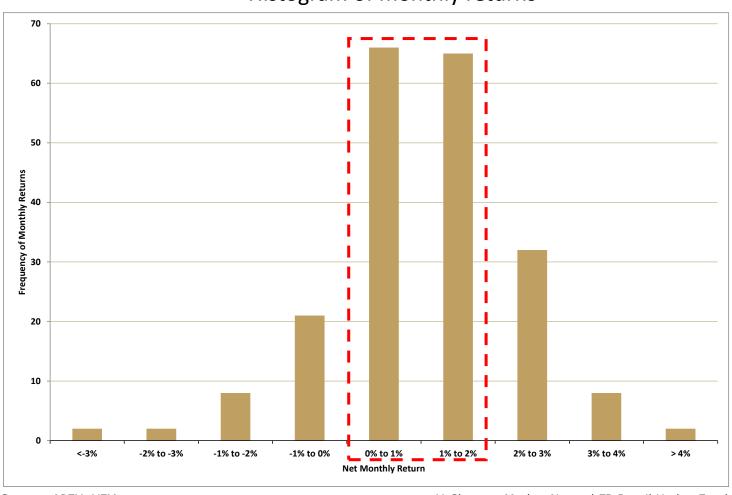

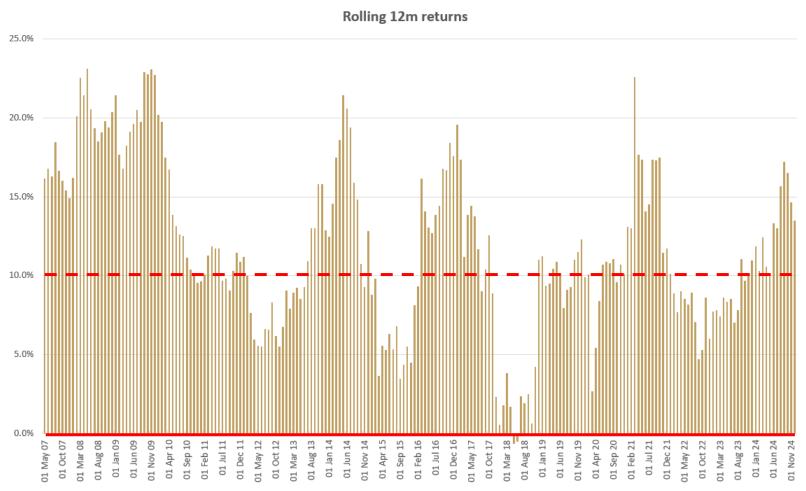
Histogram of monthly returns

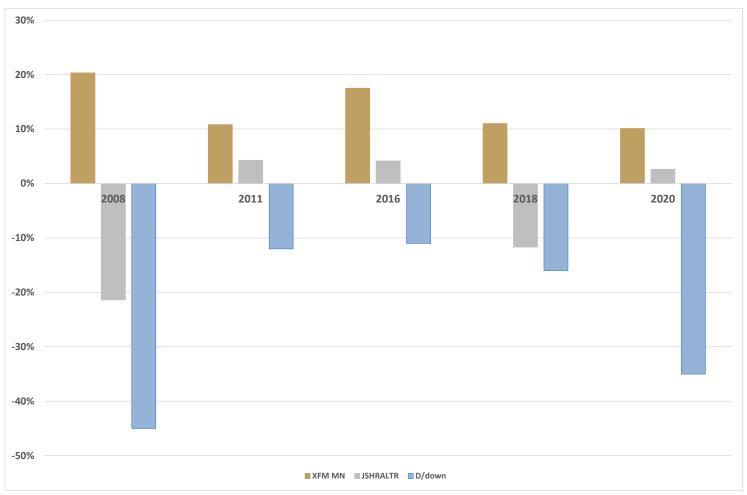

- All of this is used to trigger ideas that is then investigated and discussed by the investment team



Risk Management

Risk Management



- Market Neutral Fund, so very low net exposure
- We prioritise risk management because we like to sleep well at night
- Have developed and fine-tuned our risk management process over 20 years
- Do intra-sector pair trading, stay neutral on overall book:
 - Market caps
 - Liquidity
 - Commonality
 - Quality
 - Factor analyses (fx, interest rates, commodities, sectors)
- Limit overall positions sizes to 10% (very seldom go there...)



Biggest Mistake

Biggest Mistake / Lesson Learned



- Some astute managers had no exposure to Steinhoff, a few were even short
- We had a position in SHF at the end of 2017
- The mistake was not so much being invested in SHF
- Our biggest mistake was the sizing of the position
